



Post Dental and IV Anesthesia Care

Following a general anaesthetic or heavy sedation your pet may take a while to fully recover. Some pets recover very quickly, while others take a little longer. If you have any concerns please contact the surgery or one of the after hours services listed below. Your pet may be a little unsteady on its feet, sleepy and may shiver a little following a general anaesthetic. **Please keep them inside and warm on their first night as they are not able to maintain their body temperature as they normally would.**

Occasionally a mild cough that lasts 24 - 48 hours may occur and is due to irritation caused by the endotracheal tube used during anaesthesia to maintain your pet's airway. If this cough persists please contact the surgery.

FOOD & WATER:

Initially offer only small quantities of water as your pet may drink excessively and vomit if too much water is available at once.

If your pet is quite bright by the time your pet would normally eat its evening meal, is holding down small drinks of water and appears to be looking for food, offer a small meal.

Do not be surprised or upset if your pet does a single vomit during the first evening after the anaesthetic as this is not unusual, but withhold any further food until the next day. If vomiting continues through the evening please seek after hours veterinary attention. Please contact the surgery if your pet is not eating within 12-24 hours

EXTRACTIONS: If your pet has had any extractions then feed cubes of fresh boneless meat for 3-5 days. Avoid any type of minced meat as pieces may get lodged in the space/s where the tooth was removed. Biscuits may be too hard at this stage for your pet to chew and should be reintroduced with the advice of your veterinarian or nurse.

We do not routinely recommend feeding bones - do not feed bones during the recovery period.

RAW BONES: We do not routinely recommend feeding bones. Please have a detailed discussion with your veterinarian if you are considering feeding bones. An information sheet is also available.

PREVENTITIVE CARE:

- Greenies
- Tooth Brushing
- Maxigard- Oral Clensing gel
- Healthy Mouth Oral liquid

MEDICATION: Please ensure you know when to begin giving any required medications and then give the entire course. Make sure you know how to administer it; if unsure, please ask.

PAIN RELIEF: Your pet will have been given medication that would be expected to provide sufficient pain relief following surgery. Some more sensitive animals require more pain relief. If during the post-operative (after surgery) period you are worried that your pet is uncomfortable please contact the surgery so that we can discuss additional pain relief options.

SUTURES: Sutures used in the mouth will dissolve and usually do not need removing. Sometimes a suture will produce a loose end that can be annoying causing licking, lip smaking or pawing at the mouth. Please arrange a check up if you are concerned.

HAIR: The hair or fur that has been clipped (from the surgery site, where the anaesthetic has been given, where a blood sample has been taken or where intravenous catheters have been placed) usually regrows in 6 - 8 weeks
